HARBOUR BATH

Copenhagen's harbor is undergoing a transformation from an industrial harbor and traffic junction towards being the city's cultural and social center. The Harbor Bath design has emerged out of the desire for extending the surrounding park onto the water and the practical needs for accessibility and safety. The Harbour Bath realises the transition from land to water as a terraced landscape. Piers and platforms seem to cut rectangular or trapeze-shaped basins out of the harbor. The pointed back wall of a tribune cuts into the largest basin like the prow of a ship. The red and white stripes of the lifeguard tower evoke lighthouses and echo the harbor motif.

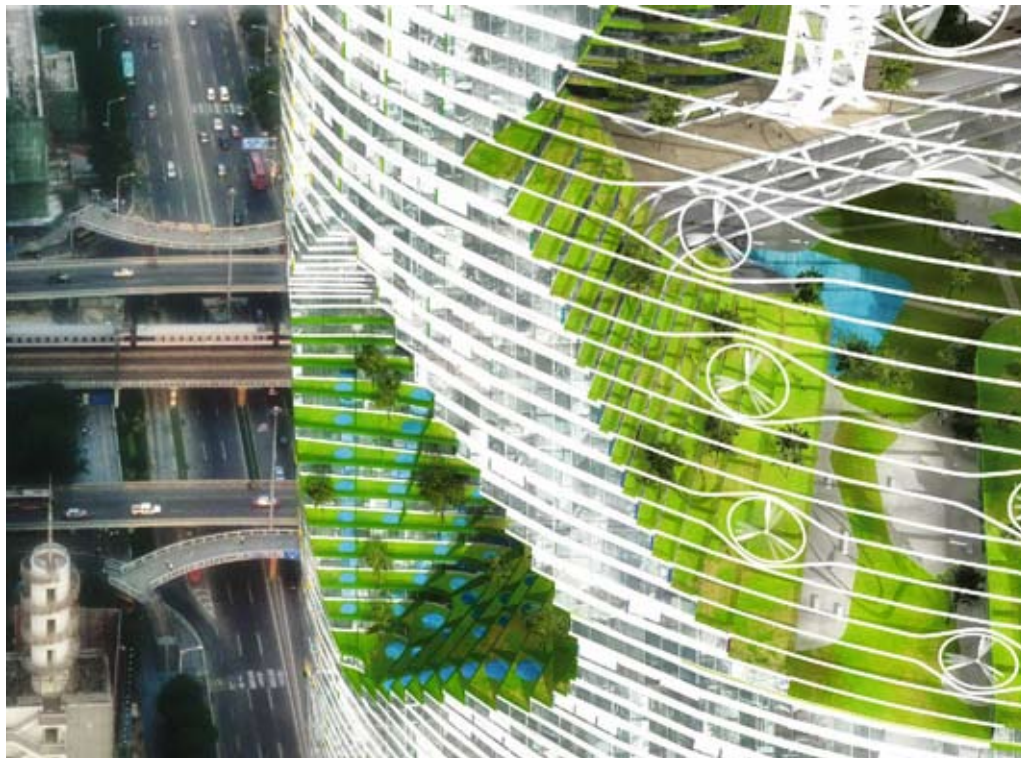

SLC – SHENZHEN LOGISTIC CITY

For a city planning project in Shenzhen the surrounding mountains have to be taken into account for they limit possibilities of expansion. They have to be made part of city planning. This creates a unique characteristic for the project. The designers were requested to design projects that included towers standing with a height of 1111m and 666m and a commercial district. This massive urban intervention will be used as a tool for reforestation in the city. The architects consider green space as the main aspect of the complex; therefore the mountain characteristic was used with ascending and descending paths, slopes and traverses. Around the buildings lush plantings were placed.
